In order to earn a bachelor's degree, students must complete 120 credits including: (a) 30 credits at Stevenson University; (b) a minimum of 15 upper level credits; and (c) all program requirements.

Students who earn an Associate of Arts (A.A.) or an Associate of Science (A.S) may be awarded up to 21 credits towards remaining general education and elective credits through the Graduate and Professional Studies Articulated College Transfer (GPS ACT). GPS ACT is offered solely through the School of Graduate and Professional Studies adult undergraduate program and is not eligible for traditional undergraduate programs.
