

## General Disclosure for Programs Meeting Licensure or Certification Requirements

### **PROGRAM: Clinical Psychology, Psy.D.**

As set out in the 1 November 2019 Final Rules in the Federal Register, the U.S. Department of Education requires that all institutions make public information regarding a program's ability to meet the licensure requirements for a particular state.

The programs customarily leading to licensure at Stevenson University have been designed to meet the licensure/certification requirements in Maryland as well as prepare students to apply for licensure exams in the State of Maryland. Students who intend to return or move to any state other than Maryland are advised to review the professional licensure disclosures pertaining to their program.

The chart below provides professional licensure disclosure information for the Stevenson University Doctor of Psychology Degree in Clinical Psychology. Please note that states may also require candidates for licensure to complete supervised clinical experiences and/or pass standardized examinations following completion of the doctoral degree in order to meet licensure requirements; this disclosure refers only to each state's doctoral training program requirements. Students should use the State Licensing Board links below to identify any additional requirements for licensure in the state(s) in which they plan to practice. “Does Not Meet” is a **temporary status** and is used here to identify states that require applicants for licensure to have graduated from an APA-accredited program. The SU program has been designed to align with APA standards; however, program accreditation is a multi-year process that requires cohort enrollment and progression through the program before application is made to APA. This table and the program website will be updated to reflect program accreditation status as the process is underway.
