She began teaching at Stevenson in 2014 as an Adjunct Professor and became a full-time Lecturer in Fall 2018. Aside from running alcohol studies in the Crayfish lab, Dr. Setzer is also interested in Alzheimer's research, specifically how diet and exercise affect memory.
