Stevenson University Campus Security (443-352-4500) and local police (911) are available to respond to emergencies.

To talk to an advocate or learn more about reporting and healing options, contact TurnAround Inc's 24-hour helpline (443-279-0379) and/or Stevenson's Wellness Center (443-352-4200).

The University also has a Student Assistance Program (800-327-2251), which is available to students 24/7. This confidential resource will provide a clinician to deal with emotional, academic, relationship, drug, or other issues including sexual misconduct. There is no charge to students.

What happens if I submit an online report?

You can submit a report using the "Submit a Report" link on the Title IX page, either anonymously or with your identity disclosed.

When you submit an online report, the report will go first to a confidential outside vendor, Lighthouse Services LLC, and then Lighthouse will submit it directly to the University's Title IX Coordinator. If you identify yourself in the report, the TIX Coordinator will contact you directly to discuss your options and next steps. If you choose to remain anonymous, the TIX Coordinator will still be able to communicate with you using Lighthouse as an intermediary and your identity will not be revealed.

Any reports received by the Title IX Coordinator will remain confidential to the extent possible. The University will not act on or investigate a complaint without the reporter's consent, unless an imminent threat to others on campus is present. Once consent is received to act on a complaint, the process will begin promptly.
