



FAQs about Spring 2022 Move-In/Re-Entry Testing/Booster

If I got COVID over winter break, do I need to complete a re-entry test?

Re-Entry testing will not be required if you have had COVID within 30 days of your return to campus and can provide documentation. Make sure you have filled out a [Student Symptom Tracker](#) informing the SU Wellness Center of your recent COVID infection and upload a photo of your positive test results to your Patient Portal (under the 'Uploads' tab).

If I had COVID recently, do I have to get a booster?

Stevenson is following the CDC guidelines which has stated that it is safe to get a booster dose as early as two (2) weeks after full resolution of symptoms. Since antibody levels may decline after a COVID infection, it is best to get your booster two weeks after full resolution of symptoms and no later than 90 days after infection. Make sure you fill out a [Student Symptom Tracker](#) noting your recent infection.

If I was just exposed to someone with COVID, can I move-in?

Please complete the [Student Symptom Tracker](#) indicating you have had a close contact exposure. The Wellness Center staff will discuss your exposure and inform you when you qualify to move-in. You should mask and get tested day 5-7 after the last day of exposure, then watch for symptoms for 10 days after last exposure. If you develop symptoms, you will need to isolate and test. If using a rapid test, make sure to mark your initials and date on the test prior to taking the photo.

If I had a close contact exposure to COVID and I am not vaccinated, can I move in?

Unvaccinated students who are exposed must do a 10-day quarantine and submit a negative test on day 8 or later in order to move in. If using a rapid test, make sure to mark your initials and date on the test prior to taking a photo of the test results for upload. You will also need to fill out a [Student Symptom Tracker](#) noting your close contact exposure.

If I develop symptoms just prior to move in, what should I do?

You should isolate at home, fill out the [Student Symptom Tracker](#), and get tested. If using a rapid test, make sure to mark your initials and date on the test prior to taking a photo of the test results for upload. The Wellness Center will contact you with further instructions.



What kind of COVID test is required for re-entry testing?

In order to return to campus, you must submit a negative COVID test from either:

1. **PCR test** administered within 7-8 days of your scheduled arrival on campus OR
2. **Two (2) separate Rapid Antigen Tests** administered within 7-8 days of your scheduled arrival on campus. The two Rapid Antigen Tests need to be taken within a 3-day window of each other and both need to be negative.

What if I cannot get a COVID test within the 7-8 day window, but I can get one later and have results before moving in, is that acceptable?

If the negative test results are received prior to move in, you should be able to move in. Testing may not be done longer than 8 days prior to move in.

Where do I submit the negative COVID test result?

Submit record of your negative PCR test result to www.stevenson.edu/negativetestresults.

Submit record of your negative test results from two Rapid Antigen tests in the manner below:

1. Complete Test #1; write your name, the date, and SU ID number on the actual test near the result; and take a picture of the result with your SU ID card.
2. Repeat two days later with Test #2; write your name, the date, and SU ID number on the actual test near the result; and take a picture of the result with your SU ID card.
3. Upload both pictures to www.stevenson.edu/negativetestresults.
