**A.A. IN SOCIAL SCIENCES, AREA OF CONCENTRATION IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE to B.S. IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE**

This transfer plan is intended for students pursuing an A.A. IN SOCIAL SCIENCES, AREA OF CONCENTRATION IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE at Frederick Community College who are interested in pursuing a B.S. in **CRIMINAL JUSTICE** at Stevenson University. The equivalencies below demonstrate how a student can meet both the requirements of the associate degree and prepare for a seamless transfer to Stevenson. Any student who enters Stevenson with an A.A. or A.S. degree will have completed all general education requirements with the exception of composition II if not taken at the community college. Please note:

- Only courses that have course equivalencies are displayed. This guide does not show all transferable courses from this college. It also does not display all Stevenson University courses that will fulfill a specific requirement.
- Program requirements must be completed with a grade of C or better, and general education courses must be passed with a grade of D or better.
- Stevenson University will accept up to 70 credits from 2-year institutions. Up to 90 credits can be applied to degree requirements from a combination of 2-year institutions, 4-year institutions, and non-direct classroom instruction (including CLEP, AP, and other nationally recognized standardized examination scores).
