KEY STEPS TO ENROLLING »

COMPLETE THE ENROLLMENT INTENT AND HOUSING RESERVATION FORM

To reserve your place for the fall 2026 semester, complete the Enrollment Intent Form and return it to the Admissions Office, along with your \$300 enrollment deposit, as soon as possible.

Please pay particular attention to the following when submitting your enrollment deposit:

The enrollment deposit is \$300 for all students. It is due May 1, 2026 and non-refundable after that date.

The \$300 will be applied to your tuition bill.

If you complete your enrollment online, payment can be made by credit card on our secure site, stevenson.edu/letusknow. If you complete your enrollment by mail, include a check or money order for \$300 made payable to Stevenson University.

Questions regarding payment of the enrollment deposit should be directed to a member of our transfer admissions team (see back for contact information).

ACADEMIC ORIENTATION, PLACEMENT TESTING, AND COURSE REGISTRATION

All new students will be required to complete an online academic orientation prior to registering for courses. The online orientation will be completed through SU's Learning Management System, Blackboard. Your Stevenson Single Sign-On is required in order to access Blackboard. Once students have completed their academic orientation, they will receive follow up instructions from the Center for Student Success regarding the course registration process. New students are required to meet with an academic advisor prior to registering for classes.

Any new student who has not received SU transfer credit for a credit-bearing math course is required to take a placement test. Placement testing must be completed in advance of your scheduled course registration. More information regarding the math placement can be found at stevenson.edu/placement.

APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID AND PAY YOUR BILL

To be considered for need-based financial aid:

Apply for a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) at fsaid.ed.gov as soon as possible. The FSA ID acts as your electronic signature to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

A parent should also apply for a FSA ID if you are a dependent student.

Complete the 2026-2027 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov as soon as possible. SU's required federal school code is **002107**.

SU Merit-Based Scholarships:

All newly admitted applicants indicating interest in full-time enrollment are automatically considered for merit-based scholarships. No separate scholarship application is required. Qualifying students are notified in this packet. Scholarship awards are based on cumulative college GPA and number of credits completed by February 1.

Paying Your Bill:

Check your mail or Self-Service Student Finance account shortly after registration for your tuition bill, and if applicable, your housing bill.

Here are some of our Frequently Asked Questions, so no concern goes unaddressed. »

How will my college credits transfer to SU?

Your official transfer credit evaluation will be forwarded when it has been completed by the Registrar's Office and a guide to understanding that evaluation will be included. Your official degree audit showing exactly what courses you have remaining to complete your degree will be available on Self-Service shortly before your registration date.

When can I visit campus?

Campus visits are available daily. See stevenson.edu/visit for more information about our visit programs or to register.

I want a different major than I listed on my application. How can I change it?

Please contact the Admissions Office before your registration day to change your major. Requests to change majors will be automatically granted except in the case of Biomedical Engineering or Nursing. The admissions committee must re-review your application to determine if you are eligible for Biomedical Engineering or Nursing. After registering for fall classes you'll need to speak with the Center for Student Success.

Will I get credit for my AP, IB and CLEP exams?

Official AP, IB and CLEP test scores are considered for college credit. A chart with our full AP, IB and CLEP credit policy is linked from stevenson.edu/accepted. Official scores should be sent to the Registrar's Office as soon as possible. Documentation Guidelines can be found on the ADS Portal.

When will I hear if I have been awarded a scholarship?

All newly admitted transfer applicants are automatically considered for a merit-based scholarship. Qualifying students are notified in this packet. Scholarship awards are based on cumulative college GPA and number of credits completed by February 1. Please see stevenson.edu/scholarships for more information.

When will I receive a financial aid award?

You can expect to receive a financial aid award within two weeks of submitting the 2026-2027 FAFSA to Stevenson and being admitted to the university.

When will I hear about living on campus?

Students who wish to live on campus should indicate so on the Enrollment Intent Form. There is no separate housing deposit for new students. Housing status

indicated on the Enrollment Intent Form does not guarantee on-campus housing. Students should complete the Residential Profile on eRezLife as soon as it is available in May and submit prompt bill payment for best consideration. The deadline for the Residential Profile is **July 1, 2026**. The fall bill is due **July 17, 2026**. Residence Life will email information about room assignments over the summer.

Who Should I Talk to About Disability Services?

The Office of Accessibility & Disability Services (ADS) facilitates equal access for students who identify as having a disability and who register with our office. Newly admitted students with disabilities who require accommodations should contact ADS as early as possible after submitting their enrollment deposit to initiate the eligibility process.

To request accommodations, students should register with ADS by using the form located at stevenson.edu/academics/student-success

under the "Accessibility and Disability Services" tab, or contact ADS directly (ads@stevenson.edu) to begin the registration process. Students will have to wait to complete the form until they have made their deposit and have their Single Sign On.

Additionally, students must submit documentation that meets the University's Documentation Guidelines and supports their requested accommodation(s). Documentation Guidelines can be found on the ADS Portal.

ADS staff will notify students of the results of their request(s) typically within two business weeks of submitting all required information.

What is Self-Service?

Self-Service is a platform for Stevenson students that you will soon have access to. Through Self-Service, you are able to view financial aid and other information (when available). Keep an eye on your email for instructions from the Technology Support Center on accessing Self-Service.

Do I need to submit health records to enroll?

Yes. Stevenson's Student Health Form must be completed by all new, full-time and part-time students. The profile is completed online through the Wellness Center Secure Patient Portal. Once students receive their Stevenson email account and Single Sign-On (one log-in and password for a variety of Stevenson services), they will

have access to this portal. Students will need to complete the Student Health Form and upload their vaccine records. Vaccine records can be obtained from your high school or healthcare provider's office. The deadline for the Student Health Profile is **June 1, 2026** for fall entrance.

All students who take classes on campus are required to be immunized against MMR (mumps, measles, and rubella) according to the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). If immunization records are not available, students will be asked to show proof of immunity through titers (blood work) results.

All students planning to live on campus at SU are required to be vaccinated according to the CDC recommendations against Meningitis ACWY (MCV4). A separate vaccination against Meningitis B is recommended but not required at this time.

Failure to submit a completed Student Health Form and upload the proof of vaccination by the designated deadline will block you from moving onto campus and/or starting classes. Stevenson University cannot be responsible for costs not covered by insurance associated with completion of the health requirements.

IMPORTANT: Students required to turn in health related information to Athletics or the Berman School of Nursing and Health Professions still MUST complete health requirements separate from those additional requirements. The information that is submitted to these other offices is NOT shared with the Wellness Center.

Do I need to send a final college transcript?

Students are required to submit an official final transcript showing all grades, and, if applicable, the degree earned. The official final transcript must either be sent from the institution attended in a sealed envelope, or submitted electronically.
