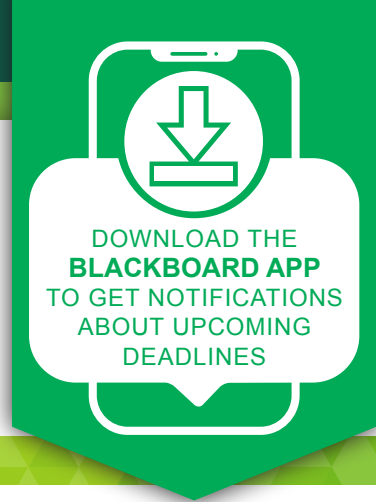

NEW STUDENT COURSE REGISTRATION



REG_100: INTRODUCTION TO UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION & RESOURCES

To complete this online course, you must first activate your Single Sign-On (SSO).

After activating your SSO, follow the steps below to begin the course:

- Sign in to the SUNow Portal with your SSO (*use your SU username and password*).
- On the right side of the SUNow Portal, under “Applications” click the link for “Blackboard.”
- Login to Blackboard with your SSO.
- Under “Courses” click on the “REG_100” course.

Each module in the course includes a “Knowledge Check.” This must be completed before you can move on to the next module. You must complete all modules before you can register for courses.

After completing *REG_100: Introduction to University Registration and Resources*, you will be able to RSVP for a specific **Summer Orientation** session starting in May. Sessions are scheduled for June and are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Remember: Send any transcripts you may have from dual enrollment or courses you took at your local community college or university. Academic credits can only be earned by sending your official college transcript—you won’t receive any academic credit for courses listed on your high school transcript.





NEW STUDENT PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT

ALEKS MATH PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT

As a new student at Stevenson, you are required to take an ALEKS Placement, Preparation, and Learning (ALEKS PPL) Assessment to determine your readiness for mathematics courses.

The assessment contains up to 25 questions and generally takes 60-90 minutes to complete. Your results will be immediately available upon completion, and you will also be able to access an individualized Prep and Learning Module to refresh your knowledge on specific topics. You can retake the assessment up to 4 times to improve your placement.

If you have any questions or concerns about ALEKS, contact your Student Success Coach. They'll be happy to help!

GUIDED PLACEMENT SURVEY

All new students are required to take a credit-bearing English course during their first semester. Your English course placement will be determined by a self-placement assessment designed by the SU English Department and included in *REG_100: Introduction to University Registration and Resources*.

Please take your time and reflect while completing the assessment in order to make the best decision for your English course placement.

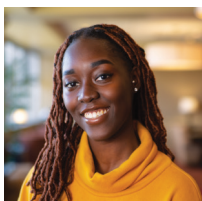

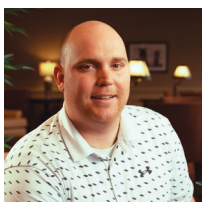

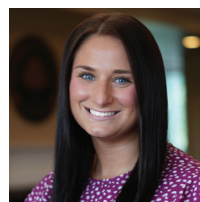

CONNECT WITH YOUR STUDENT SUCCESS COACH

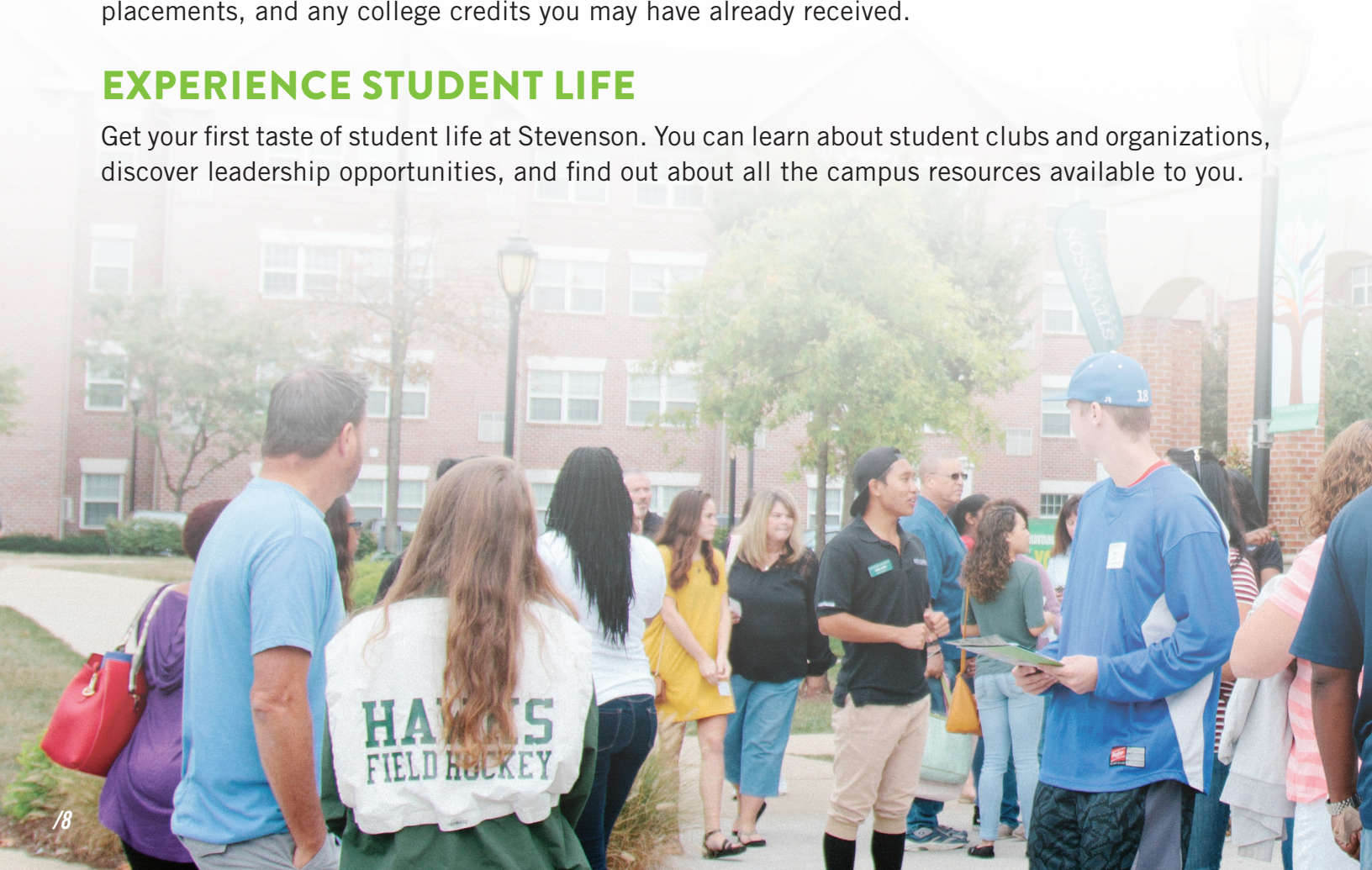
Meet with your Student Success Coach. They will be your academic advisor during your first year, and can provide helpful advice, tips, and support as you transition to university life.

INTERNSHIPS

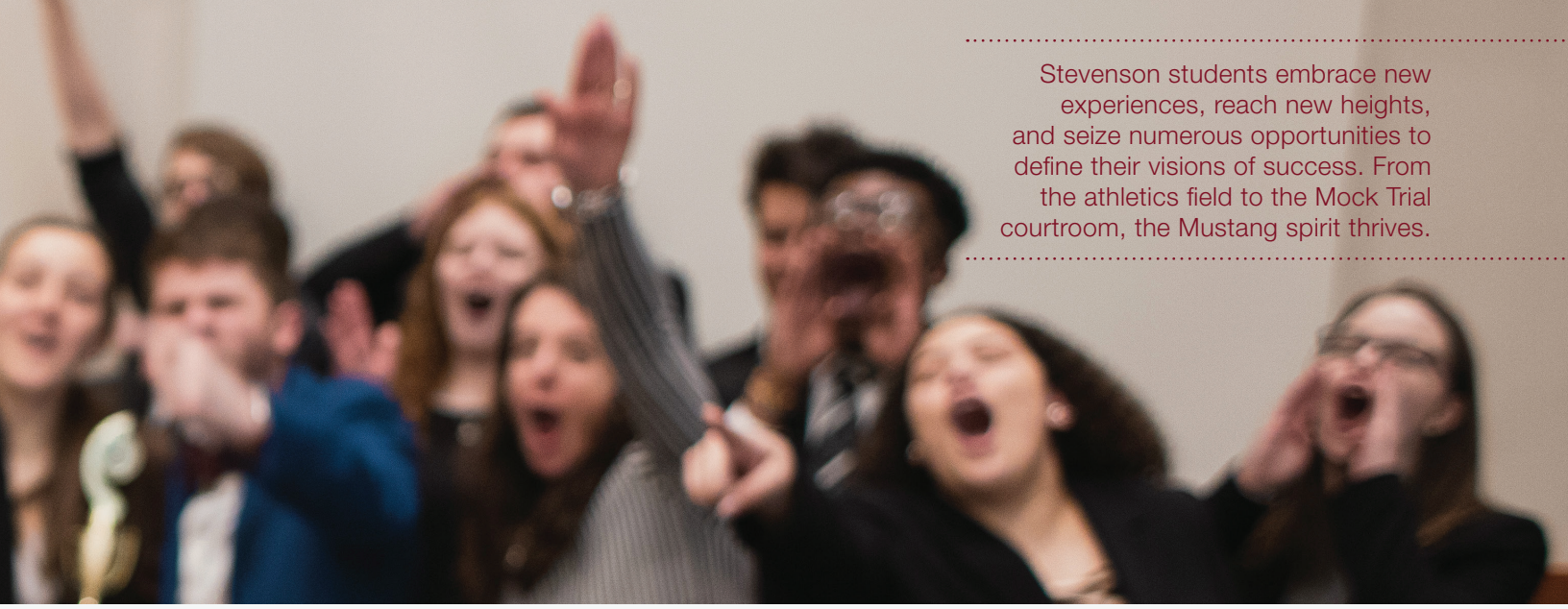

HONORS PROGRAM

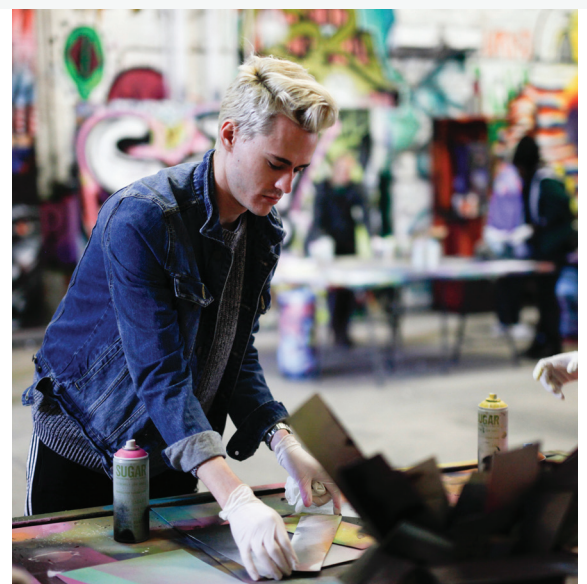

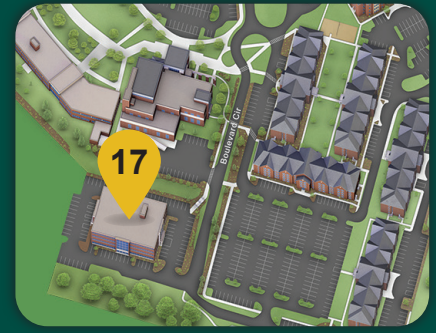

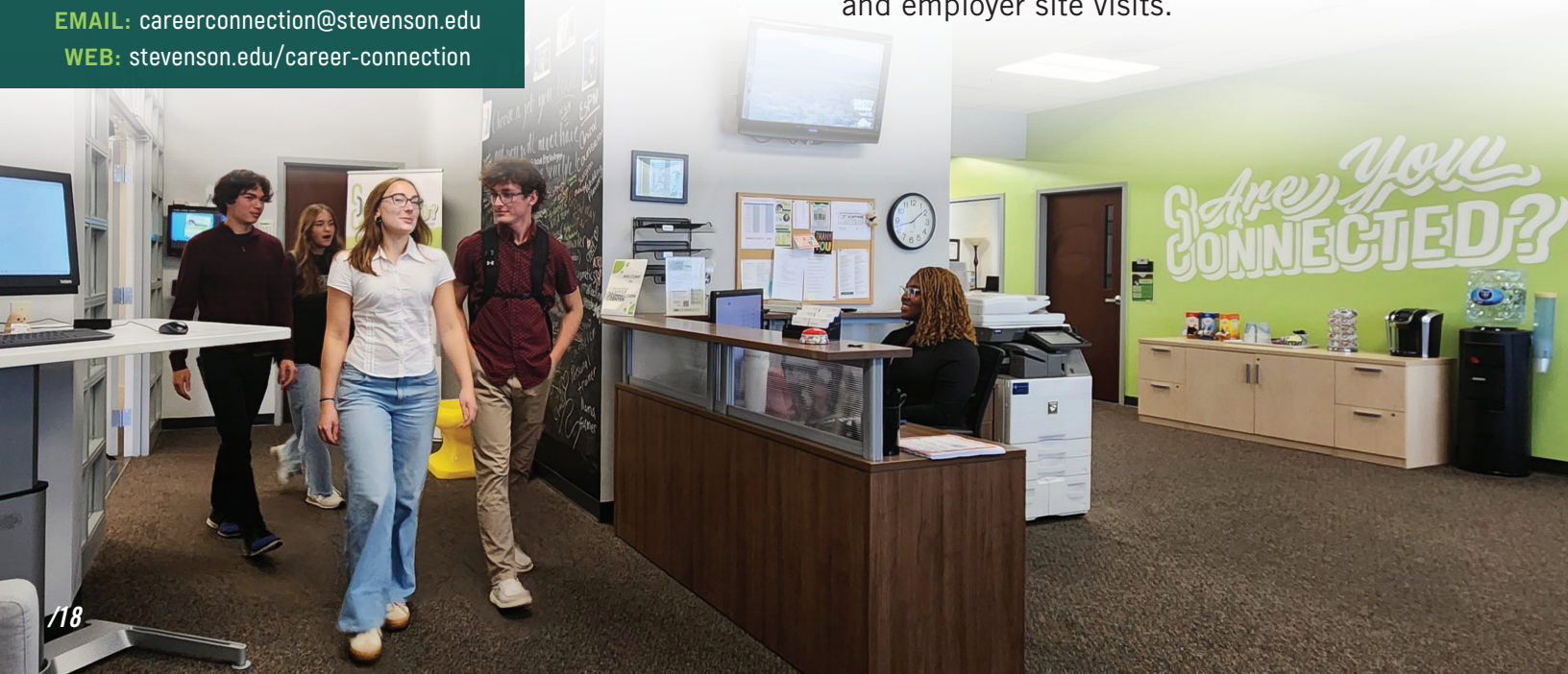

MANAGE STUDENT REFUNDS

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Once per academic year, students are **required** to review and accept the Annual Financial Responsibility Agreement. The agreement is located in the 'Required Agreements' area under your profile in Self-Service.

BOOK VOUCHERS

Students are eligible for a book voucher if their financial aid is in excess of their semester charges. If eligible, book vouchers will be

available on your SUOne card beginning two (2) weeks prior to the start of the semester for use in the Campus Store.

ONLINE COURSE MATERIALS

Some courses take part in the Inclusive Access (IA) or Cengage Unlimited, digital educational materials delivery programs. The programs provide immediate digital access to required course materials via Blackboard at significantly discounted prices. Charges will be billed with tuition charges to your account.

FERPA/PROXY ACCESS

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) requires Stevenson to obtain a student's permission before providing access to their educational records. Assigning Proxy Access allows the student to grant parents, grandparents, guardians, or other users access to their student's records in the following areas:

- Student Finance
- Financial Aid
- Academics
- (General) Notifications
- Tax Information

Once Proxy Access is assigned, the person receiving the access (the proxy) can see the specified information, and the University is authorized to speak on this information to the proxy.

MAINTAINING YOUR AID

Any aid you receive includes certain requirements to maintain your eligibility and continue to receive the funds you have been awarded. Most awards require you meet satisfactory academic progress, to be enrolled in a specific number of credit hours, and/or to maintain a minimum grade point average. Some items on your offer letter will require action on your part after

Note that making changes to your schedule can have an immediate effect on your aid. Schedule changes can result in an adjustment to your aid at the time you make the change, and may require you to repay funds. Pay attention to potential aid adjustments, which may occur if:

- You audit a class
- You add or drop a class
- You withdraw from all your classes

There are also regulations limiting the use of federal funds to pay for repeating a course.

Federal awards (Pell Grant, Direct Subsidized loans, and work-study) are need-based and the amount awarded is determined by evaluating need when the FAFSA is processed. A FAFSA must be submitted each year, and awards may change from year to year if the financial circumstances change. **For the most up to date information on filing the FAFSA, please visit the Financial Aid website.**

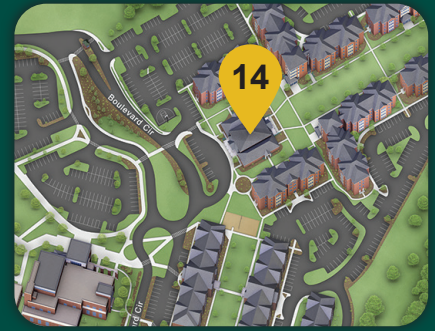


TECH TIPS FOR NEW STUDENTS

- Your Single Sign-On account allows you to access numerous campus services including email, the SUNow Portal, MyAccount password management, Self Service, and Blackboard. Information on how to set up and access your account will be sent to the external email address on file from your application.
- WiFi is available throughout all academic, residence, and administrative buildings, as well as in all interior and exterior common gathering areas.
- Stevenson offers all students \$15 of free printing each month. Simply use "WebPrint" to submit your print jobs from your personal computer.
- All students are provided with a Microsoft Office 365 account, including a full 1 terabyte of storage on Microsoft OneDrive. If you'd like, you also have the option of downloading and installing Microsoft Office applications on your personal computer.
- Most services and web-based applications work on Chromebooks. However, not all academic applications are designed for that platform and you may encounter issues if using a Chromebook.
- Desktop workstations (Windows and Macs) are located in numerous labs and classrooms throughout campus. These computers are available to all students who need them to complete any academic work.
- We recommend using the free Microsoft Outlook app to access your email on your mobile device.
- If you are planning to purchase a new computer, we recommend a PC or Mac with the following minimum specifications:
 - 16 GB of RAM
 - Built-in camera and/or microphone
 - The latest version of the platform's operating system
- We highly recommend damage coverage insurance for your laptop. If needed, several local businesses offer computer repair services.

TRANSPORTATION

Services

Stevenson's complimentary shuttle service operates Monday through Saturday, except on holidays.

Shuttles board in front of Ratcliffe Community Center on South Campus, and on the north end of the Manning Academic Center building on North Campus. There is also a regularly scheduled shuttle service to and from the Owings Mills Metro station seven days a week and on holidays.

During breaks when class is not in session, there is no scheduled campus shuttle service. Instead, shuttle service will be provided as needed. The regular schedule for the Metro remains in place.

SERVICE TO NORTH CAMPUS

Shuttles begin running at 7:15 a.m. from the Ratcliffe Community Center at quarter hour increments or when full. Shuttles leave North Campus on quarter hour increments, starting at 7:30 a.m. or when full. The last shuttle will leave Ratcliffe Community Center at 9:45 p.m. and leaves North Campus at 10 p.m. On Fridays, the last shuttle leaves North Campus at 6 p.m.

There is no regular shuttle service to North Campus on Saturdays or Sundays.

SERVICE TO GREENSPRING CAMPUS

There are no regularly scheduled shuttles going to the Greenspring Campus. Shuttle service will only be on request and will depart either at the top of the hour or at the half hour mark. Shuttles board and unload in the front circle of the Greenspring Campus.

The **Wellness Center** offers Health Services and Counseling Services to help you maintain your optimal health and achieve your full academic and personal potential. You can access both services on the top level of the Caves Sports and Wellness Center on South Campus.

HEALTH SERVICES

Limited primary care services are offered by appointment with one of our healthcare providers. A minimal fee will be billed to your account for services and supplies; private health insurance is not accepted for payment. Basic first aid, comfort, advice, health information, and assistance with community referrals are also provided. Health awareness events including health education, screenings, vaccine clinics, and guest speakers are held frequently throughout the semester.

COUNSELING SERVICES

We provide short-term individual therapy to help you maintain and develop your emotional well-being and achieve your educational and personal goals. Counseling appointments and group therapy are confidential. Urgent and initial visits are provided no cost. A minimal fee will be applied to your Student Account for continuing individual sessions. Group therapy is offered at no cost.

STUDENT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All new students (commuter and residential) are required to complete the Student Health Form by **June 1**. The online form includes your medical history, your emergency contact information, and a tuberculosis screening questionnaire. If your tuberculosis screening is positive, you must complete either a PPD skin test or blood work showing you are free from tuberculosis. These can be completed with your primary care provider or at an urgent care center. You can find the form in your student health portal at:

All students living in on-campus residential housing are required to be immunized against meningococcal disease (meningitis). The meningitis ACWY vaccination must not be older than 5 years from the date of move-in.* If the primary dose of meningitis was administered before your 16th birthday, a booster will be required before move-in. All students are required to have two doses of MMR. The COVID and flu vaccines are recommended, not required.

All new students are required to complete three online health promotion trainings for alcohol and drugs, hazing awareness, and sexual assault prevention. Students will receive a link to the training in their SU email.

FIRST YEAR RESIDENCE

For many, living on campus is their first experience living away from home. Don't worry! You'll find all the comforts of home as you adapt to life at Stevenson and grow more independent.

RESIDENTIAL STAFF

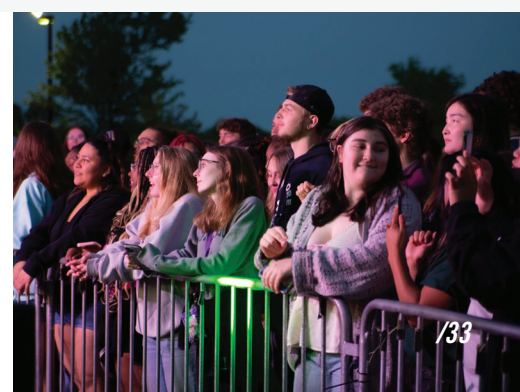
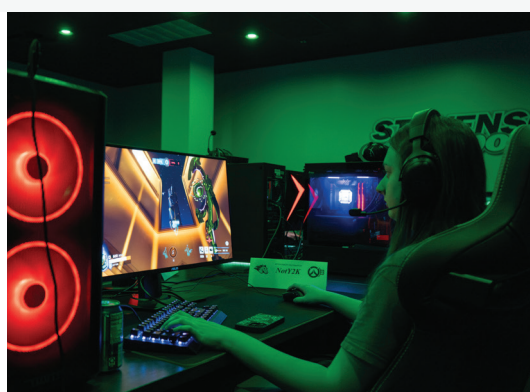

The **A-TRADITIONAL** includes 14 meals per week at any location, plus \$300 Flex Dollars (\$225 on campus and \$75 off campus)

The **A BLOCK PLAN** averages 14 meals per week. You're guaranteed a full complement of 225 swipes for the semester with the freedom to use each as many times in the day as you desire (limited to 3 per visit). **All block plans include 10 guest meals so you can treat friends or family to a delicious dining experience.** Residential meal plans begin automatically upon move-in.

If you use all available blocks before the end of the semester and you want to continue to participate in a meal plan, additional blocks of 10, 25 or 50 meals may be purchased at the Students Accounts Office located on the second floor of Garrison Student Union on South Campus.

While we offer various meal plans, all students living in the suites and Wooded Way must participate in one of the A Plans during their first through fourth semesters at Stevenson. **THERE ARE THREE OPTIONS WITHIN THE A PLANS** (see above chart for A Plan options).

Note: Meal swipes do not rollover from semester to semester or year to year. Flex Dollars do rollover. Flex Dollars can only be added to an EXISTING plan.

Commuting students may also choose to purchase any meal plan. However, the **E BLOCK PLAN** is specifically designed for commuter students, can help save time and money, and removes the need to plan meals in advance.

Commuter students should visit the Student Accounts office to add a plan.

SUOne CARD

Remember: Your SUOne Card is necessary to use your meal plan. You also need it to enter residence halls and complete other important activities. Be sure to carry your SUOne Card with you at all times.

FLEX DOLLARS

"Off Campus" Flex Dollars can be used at any on-campus Sodexo operated dining locations OR any participating off-campus merchants. Whereas "On Campus" Flex Dollars can ONLY be used at on campus locations. They're easy to use. Simply swipe your SUOne Card when you make a purchase at any participating location. The balance will immediately be deducted from your Flex account. If your funds run out, you can add more Flex Dollars online or at the Student Accounts office.

You need to have a meal plan to receive or obtain more Flex Dollars. However, unused Flex Dollars roll over from semester to semester and year to year until fully depleted or you leave Stevenson.

Stevenson University's athletic facilities are among the best at the Division III level nationally. Our athletic facilities serve the needs of over 1,000 NCAA, club, and intramural athletes and the students. 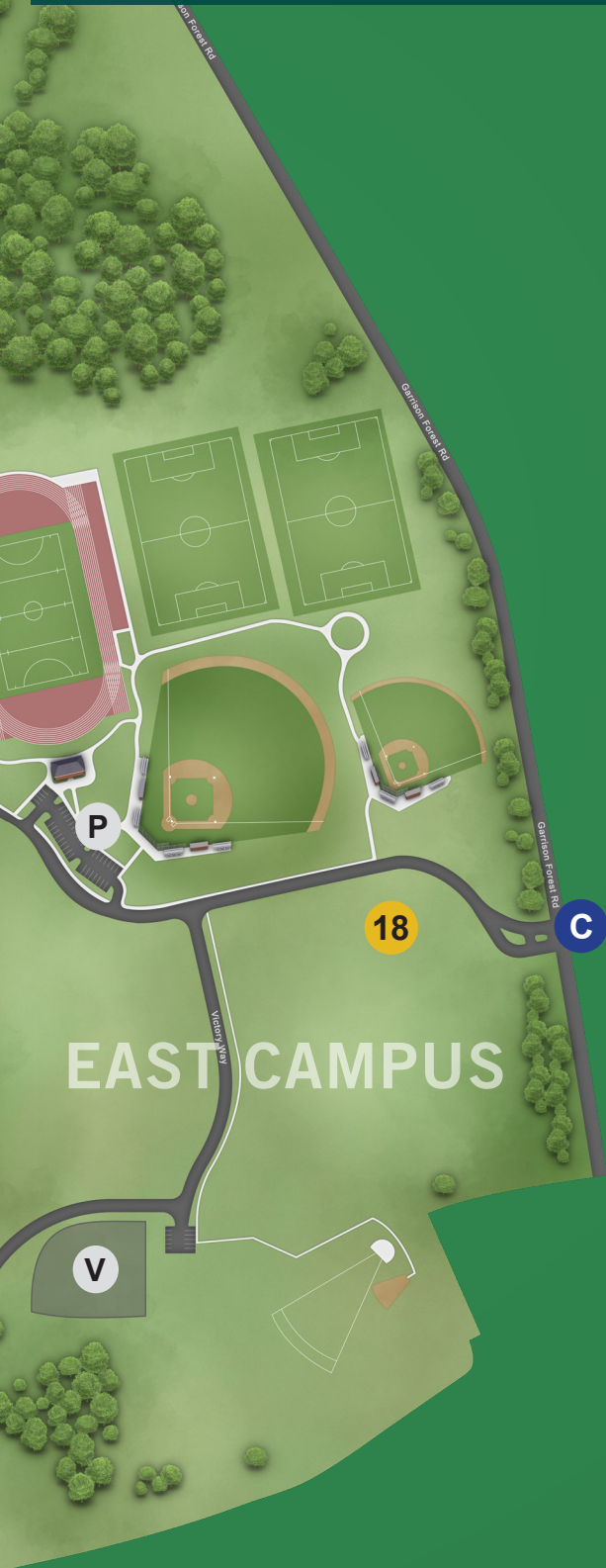
