Transfer Plan Frederick Community College Social Science Transfer: Psychology Concentration

This transfer plan is intended for students pursuing an Associate of Arts in Social Science Transfer: Psychology Concentration at Frederick Community College who are interested in pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Psychology at Stevenson University. The equivalencies below demonstrate how a student can meet both the requirements of the associate degree and prepare for a seamless transfer to Stevenson. Stevenson participates in block transfer. Any student who enters Stevenson with an A.A. or A.S. degree will have completed all general education requirements with the exception of a second composition course if not already taken.

- Only courses that have course equivalencies are displayed. This guide does not show all transferable courses from this college. It also does not display all Stevenson University courses that will fulfill a specific requirement.
- Program requirements must be completed with a grade of C or better, and general education courses must be passed with a grade of D or better.
- Stevenson participates in reverse transfer should students transfer after completing 15 credits at Frederick but before completing the full associate's degree.
